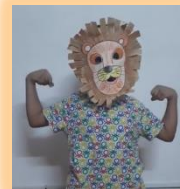

MAHATMA GANDHI JAYANTI OCTOBER 2



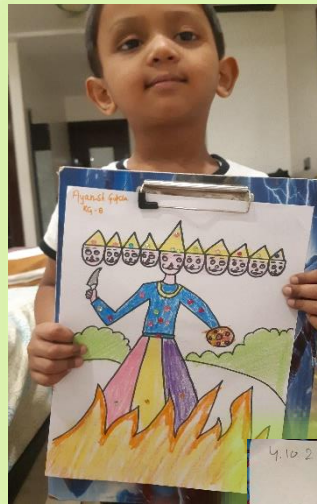
**“You must be the change you wish to see in the world” –

A special assembly was conducted on the virtual platform in which children dressed up as Bapu, presented an enactment on Gandhiji's three monkeys embodying the proverbial principle of "see no evil, hear no evil and speak no evil." 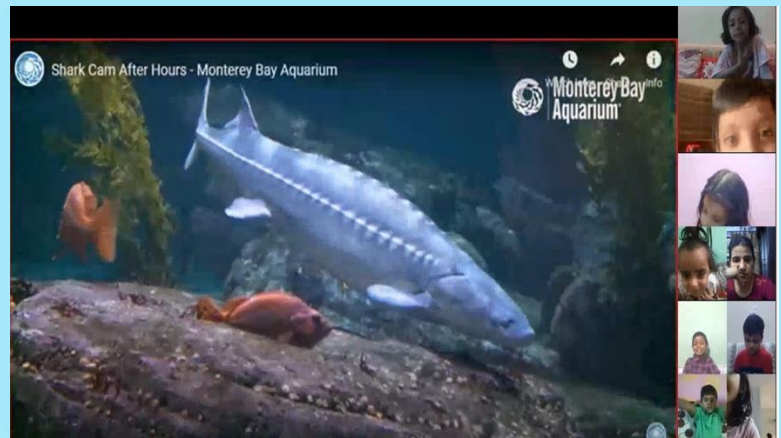

In continuation of the chapter on animals, this month aquatic animals were taken up. Students were taken on a virtual tour to acquaint them with the marine creatures followed by the dolphin show and the ppt. They could learn the names of all their aquatic friends and their special characteristics. They also learnt the biggest threat marine mammals face today. In order to make them understand this, an oil spill activity was conducted in which children took water in a bowl and mixed it with oil and plastics and dropped a toy water animal into it and observed that just as the oil and plastic sticks on to the body of the toy animal in the experiment the same thing happens in the ocean with their marine friends.

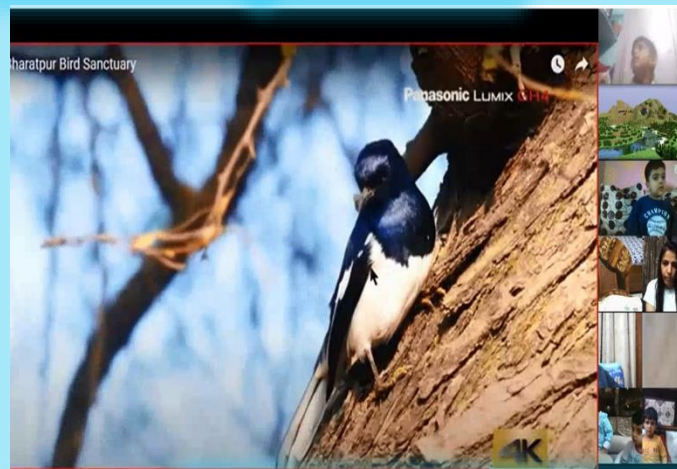




Birds

Students prepared head gears of different marine animals and were happy to wear them on their heads.

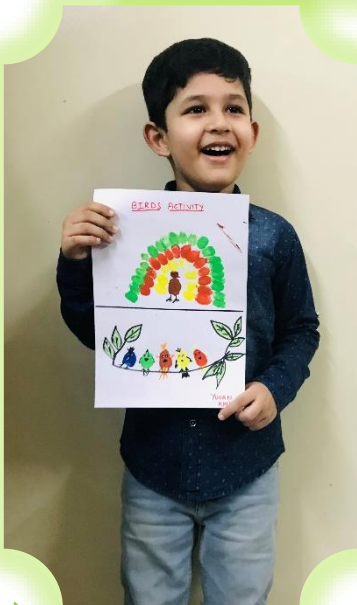

Students created different types of birds through finger printing.

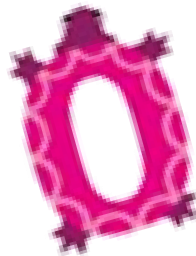
