As always, we wish to express our sincere gratitude toward our entire school community. We would not be the amazing school that we are without the help and support of all of you.

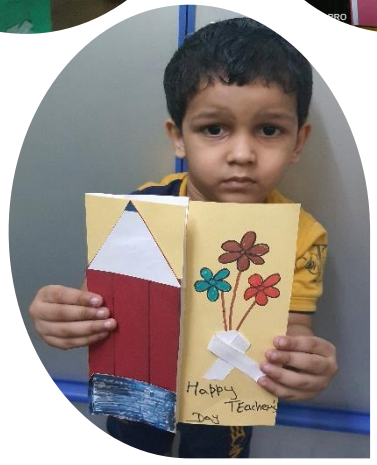

Grandparents Day Celebration

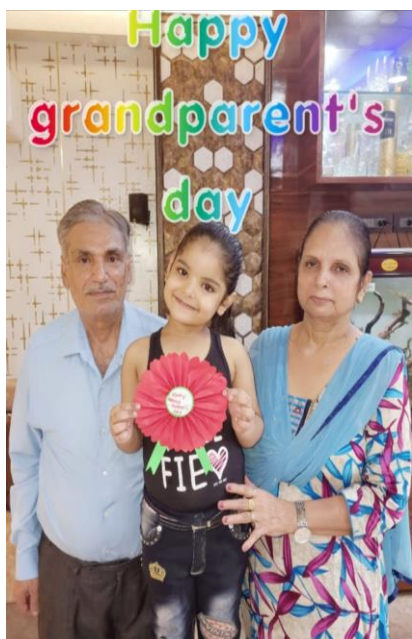

On the occasion of Grandparent's Day, students prepared a badge for their grandparents and clicked a picture with them.



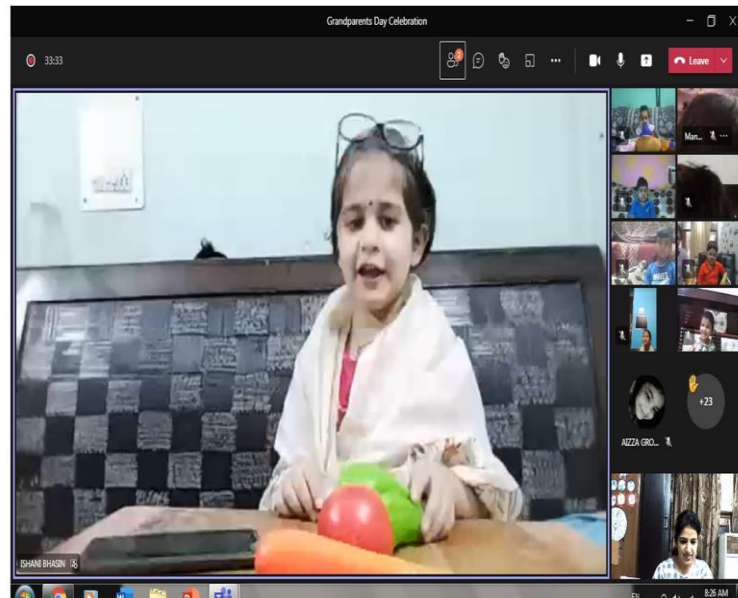
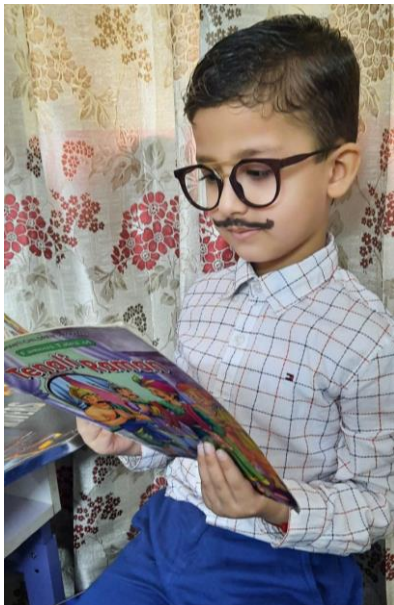

A special assembly on Grandparents' Day was conducted in which the students performed with their grandparents, narrated stories, sang songs and performed role plays.

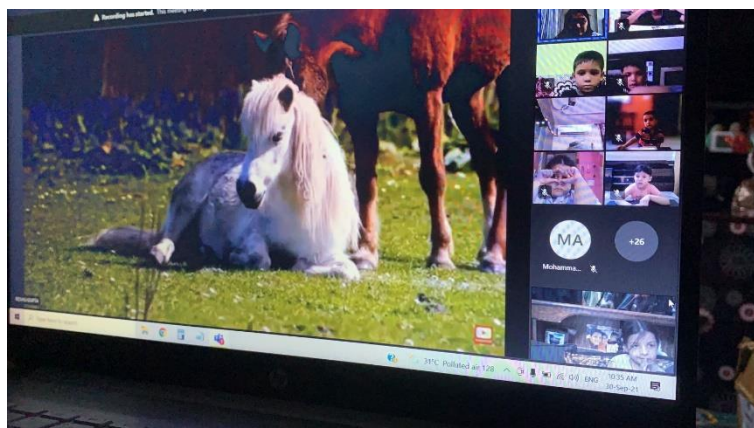
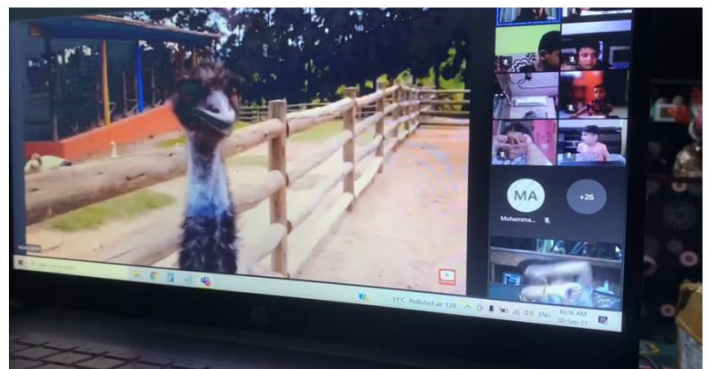




In Environmental studies students explored on the chapter animals using the STEAM approach.



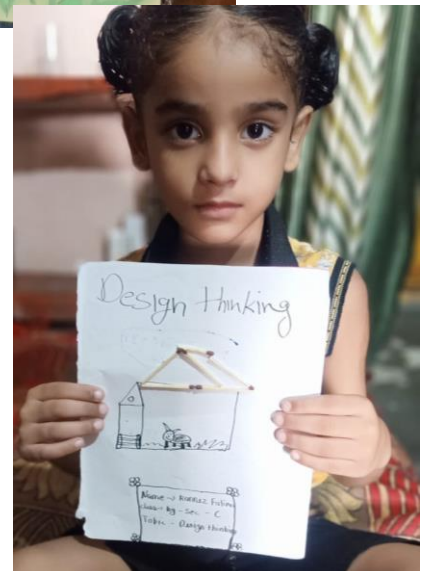

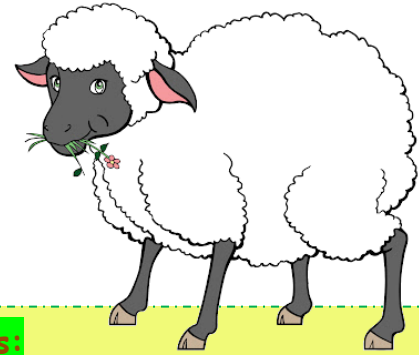




Activity on pet animals:

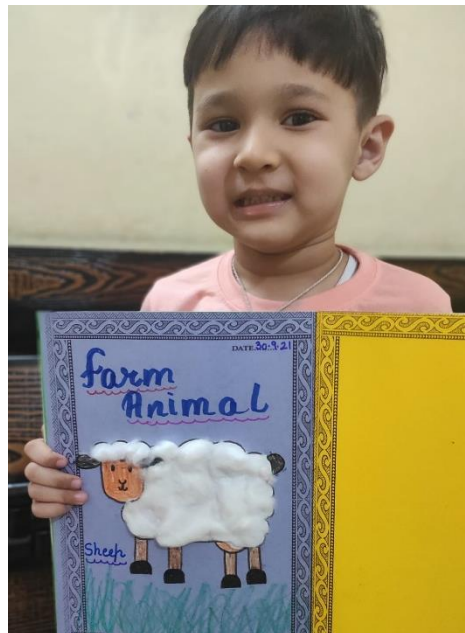
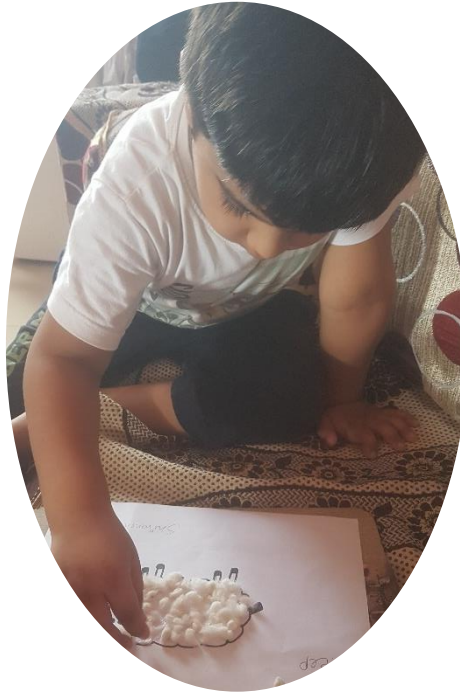
Students drew/pasted their favourite pet on an A4 sheet and did tearing & pasting on that and also wrote a few facts about these animals.

Cotton pasting on the cut out of a sheep.



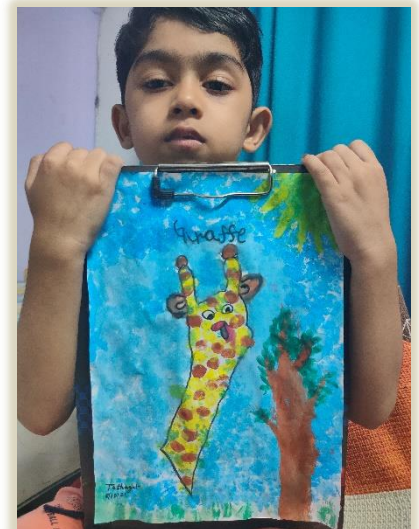

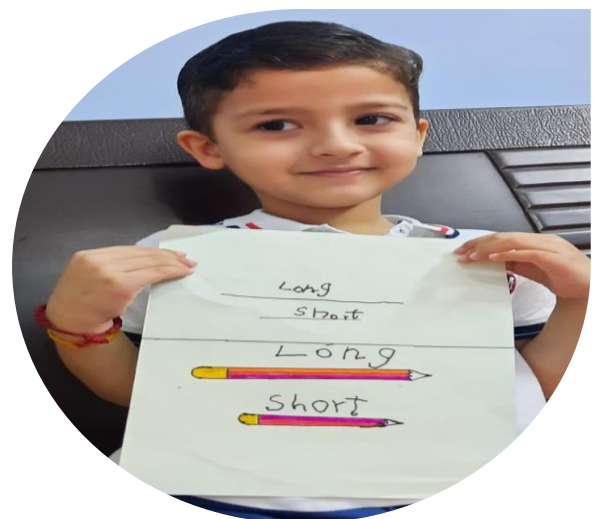
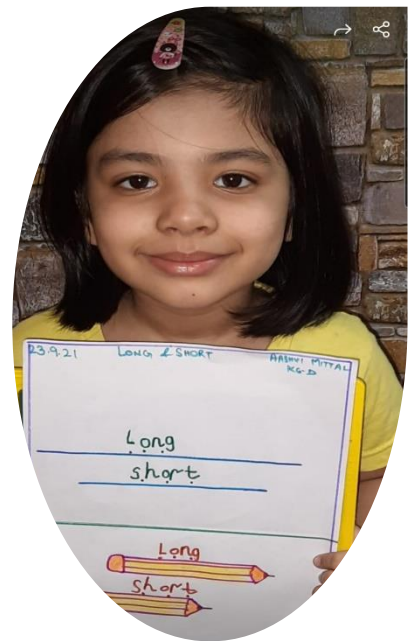
Activity on wild animals:

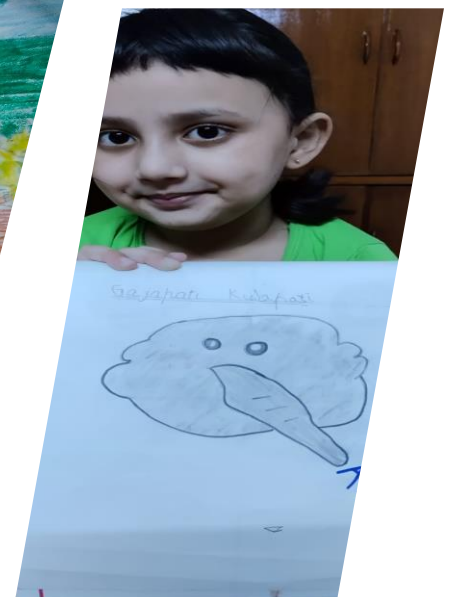


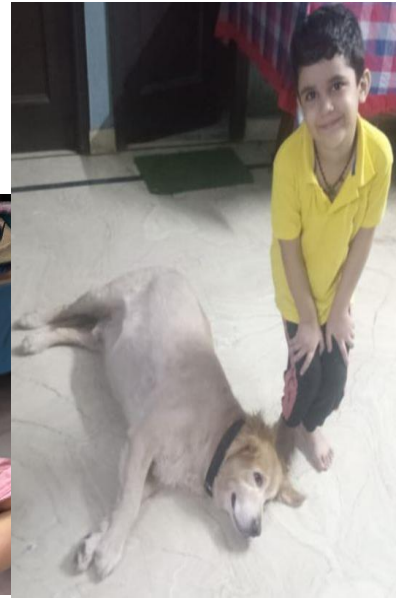


SEL Stories on empathy and kindness towards animals:






The story revolved around generating a sense of affection and kindness towards stray animals.






Students were shown videos on endangered animals and how to save and protect them.
