Stay safe and healthy.

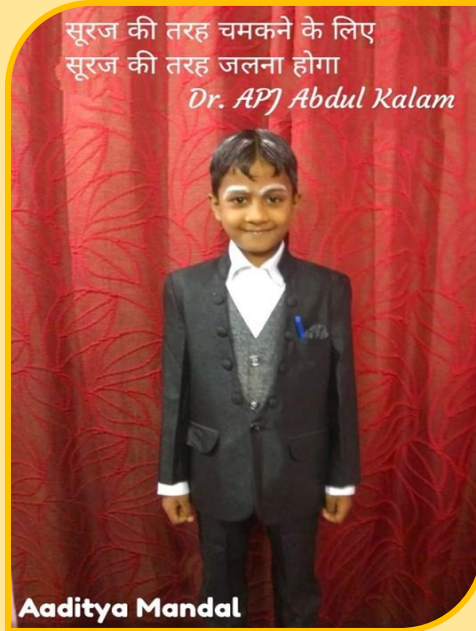

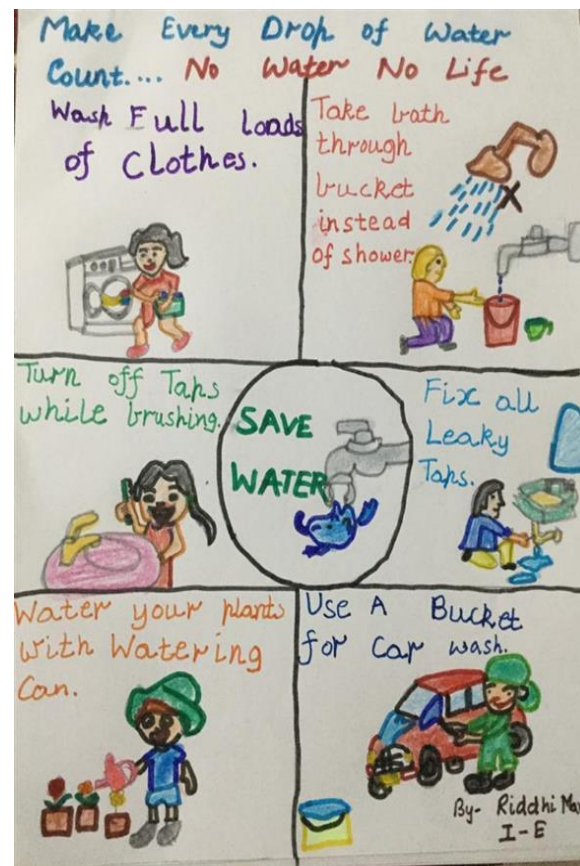


# DESIGN CHALLENGE
