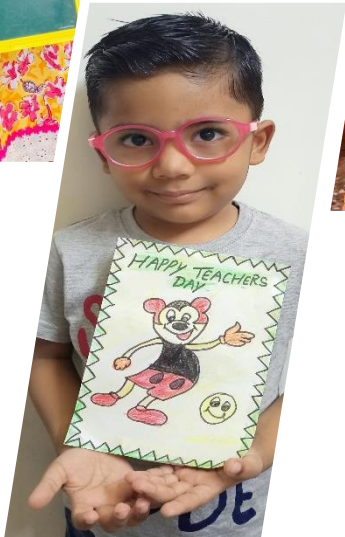
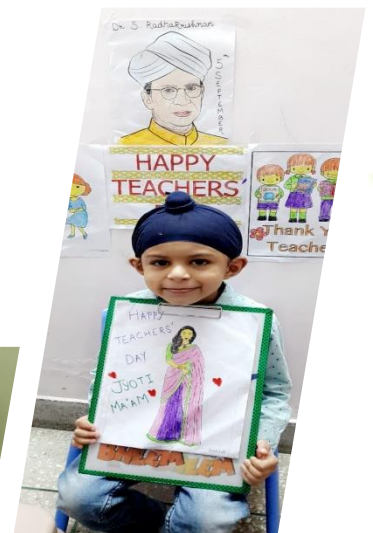


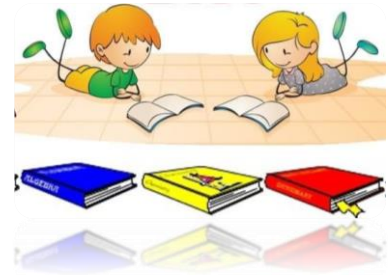
Events & Celebrations

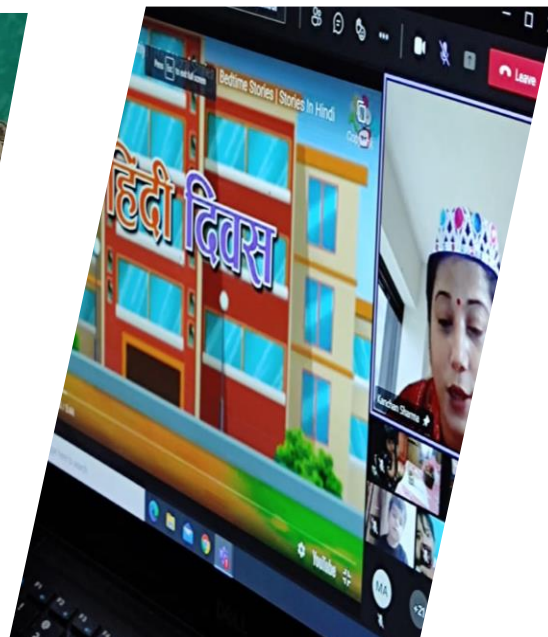
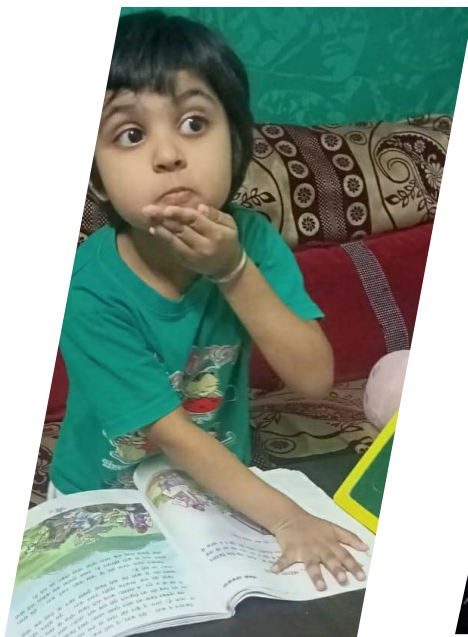

Students were shown a video which encouraged them to converse in their National language. They all had fun using words like- Dhanyawaad, aapkaswagathai, shukriya etc.





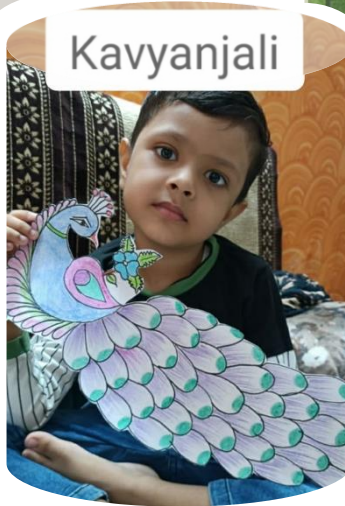

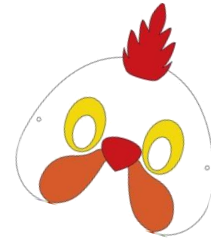




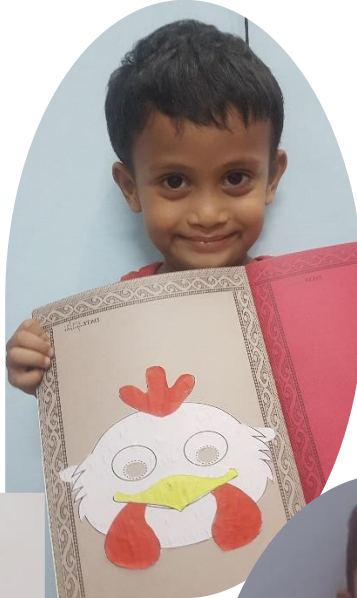
Students enjoyed visiting a farm virtually. They are now aware about the names, sounds, young ones, homes and the products we get from the farm animals.

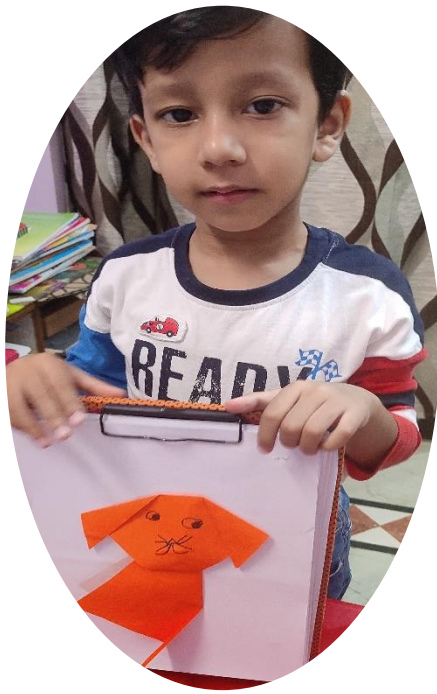


Art Integration



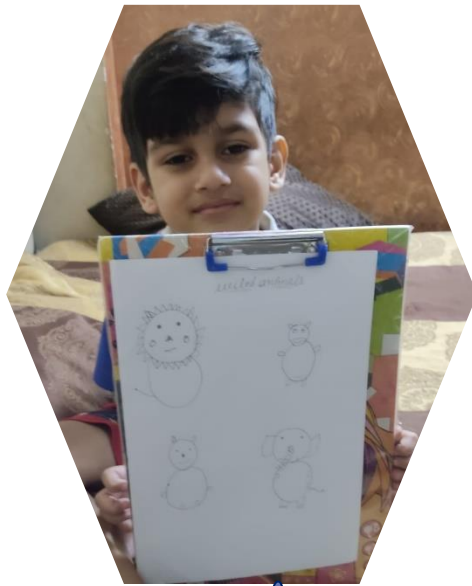
Students showed their creativity by making a mask of the hen and then pasted it in the scrapbook.





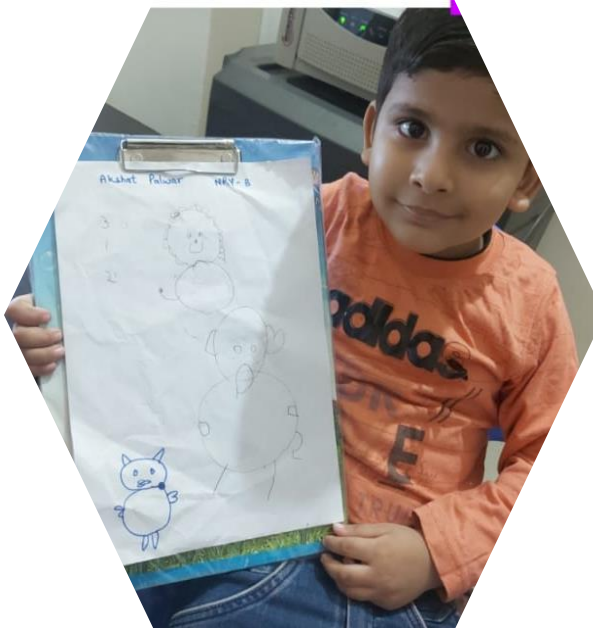
The tiny tots used their motor skills to do paper folding and made a dog for themselves. They even kept different names for their dog.

By now our little ones have mastered the art of drawing. They drew animals with guidance from the teacher.

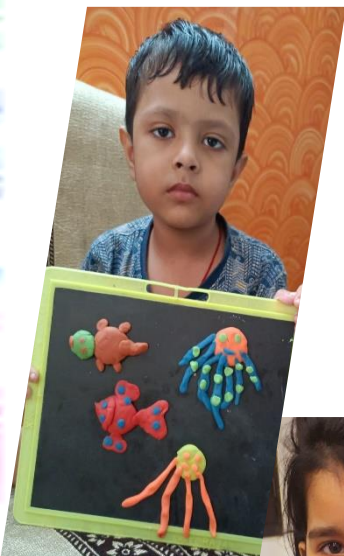

The tiny tots showed their creativity and love for animals by making different aquatic animals using clay.





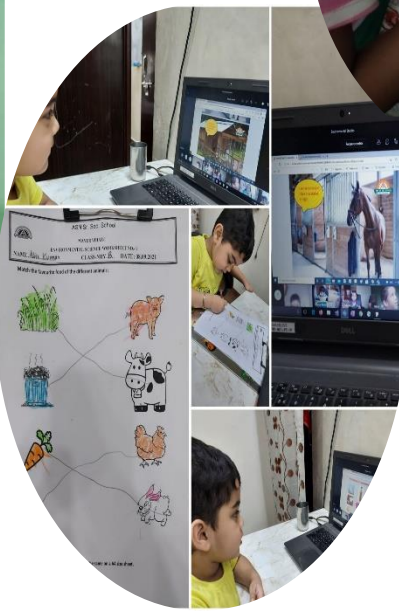
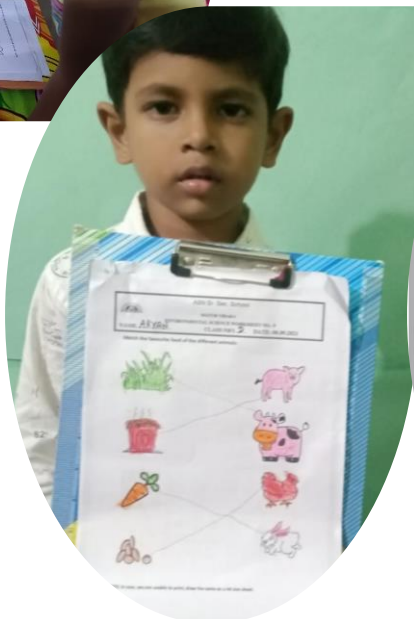
Students enthusiastically participated in the role play. They dressed up like different animals and spoke few lines/amazing facts about them.

Through the story the students were made aware about the effects of water pollution on aquatic life and how we can save water animals with help of a story. They all took a pledge to save animals.

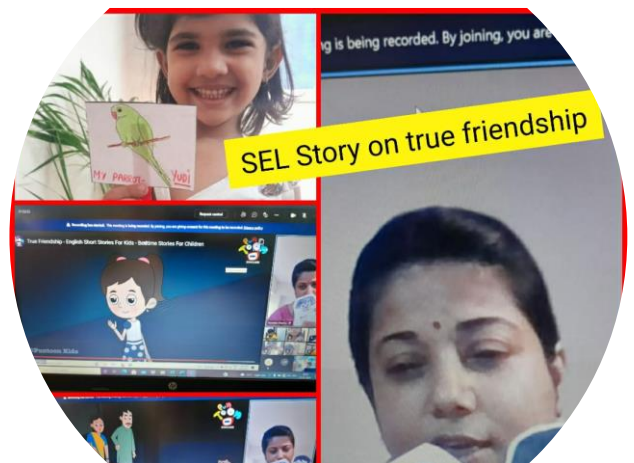





Story

Students enjoyed watching the story in virtual class and learnt that we should be kind towards animals and that they are our best friends.

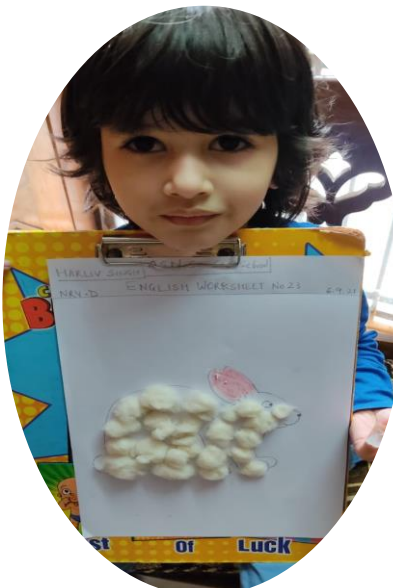




Academics

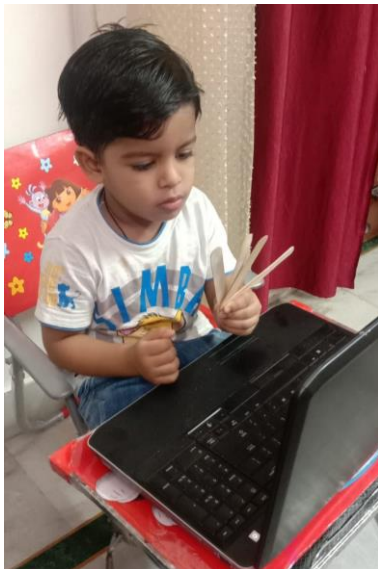
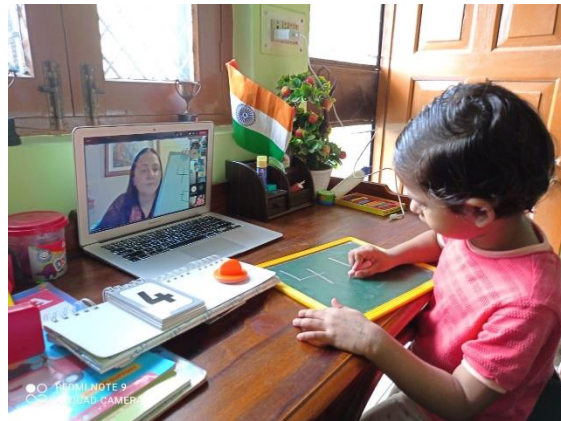




Introduction Of Number 4



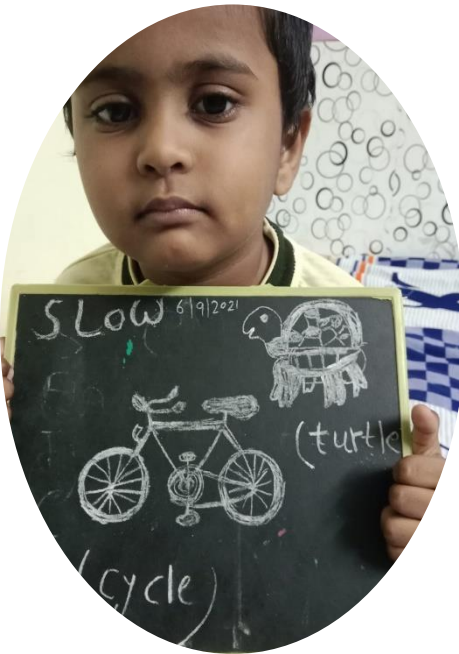

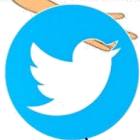
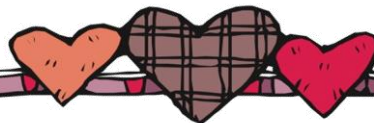
