Conserve Energy to Preserve the Future

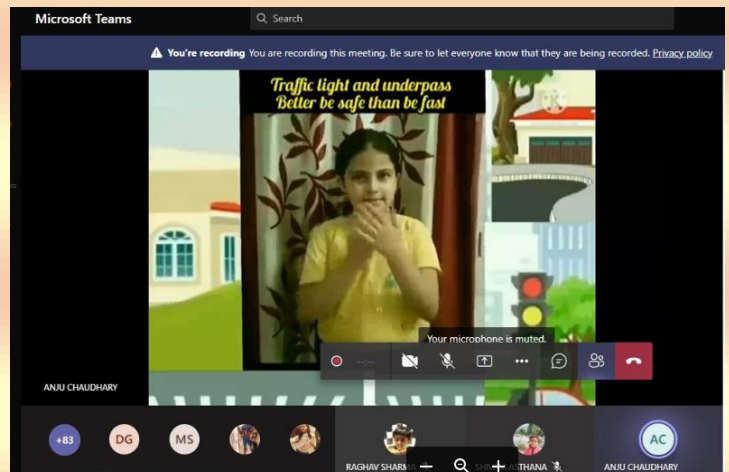
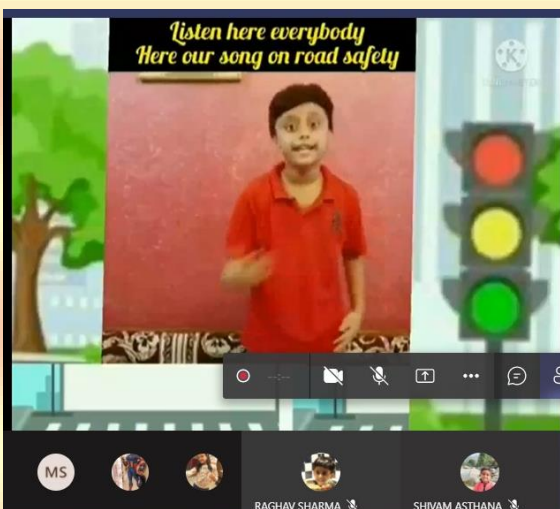
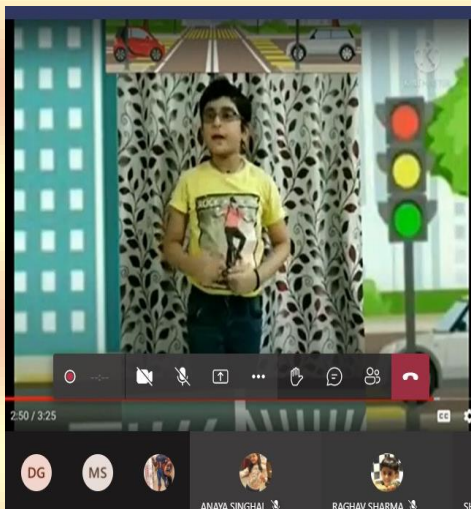

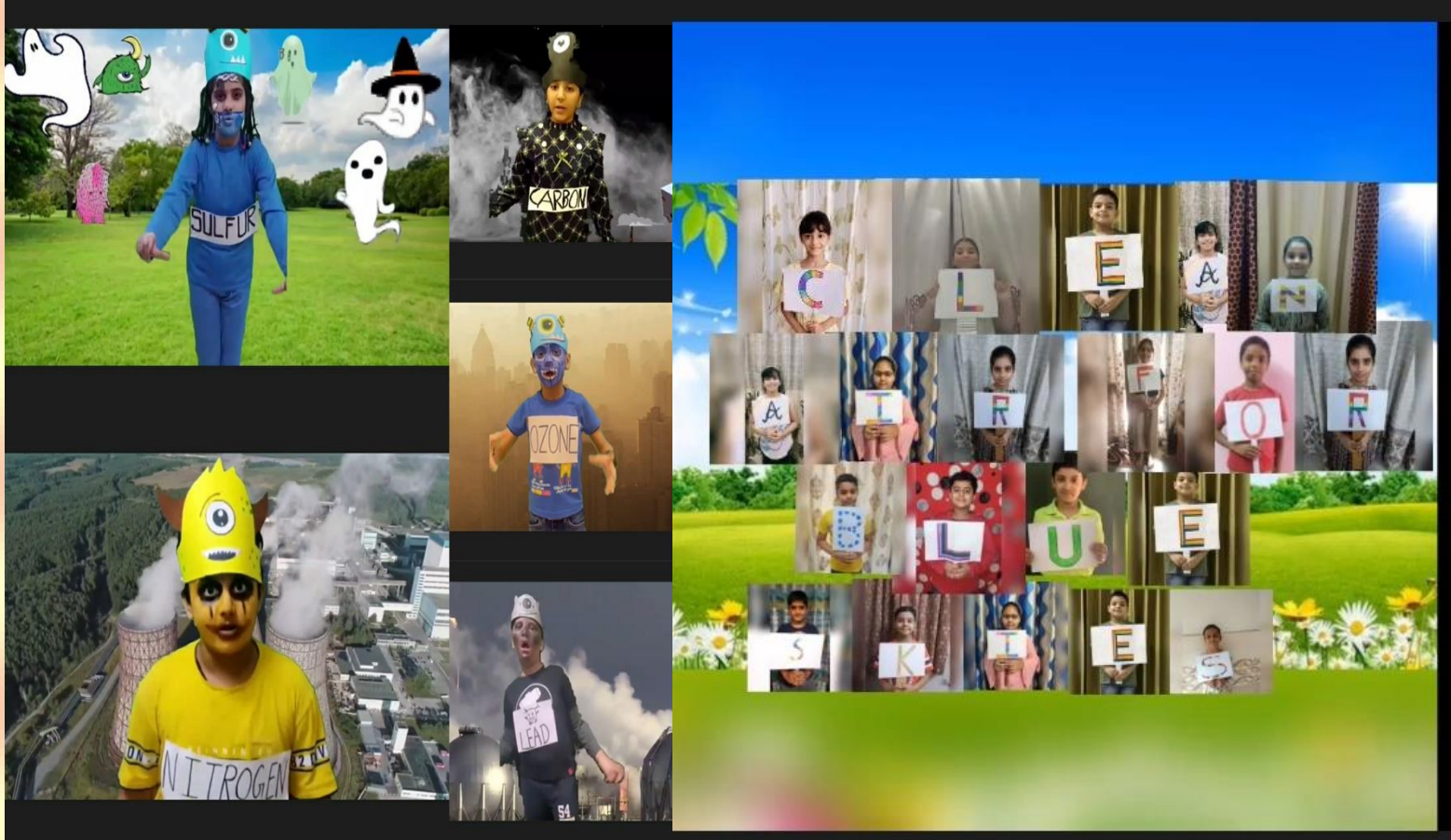
Clean Air for Blue Skies

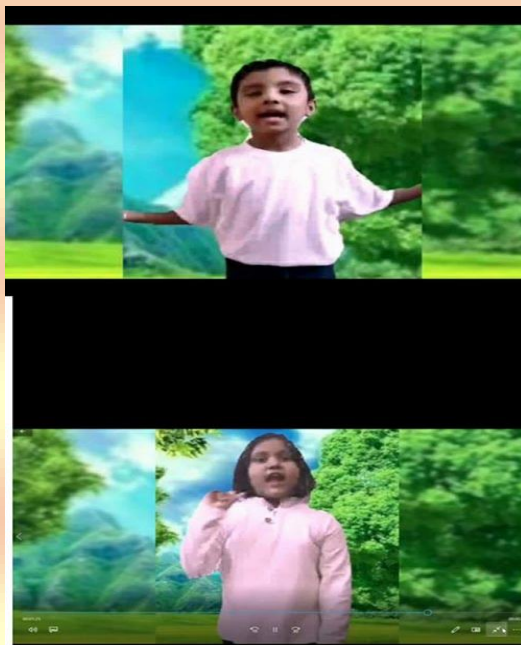
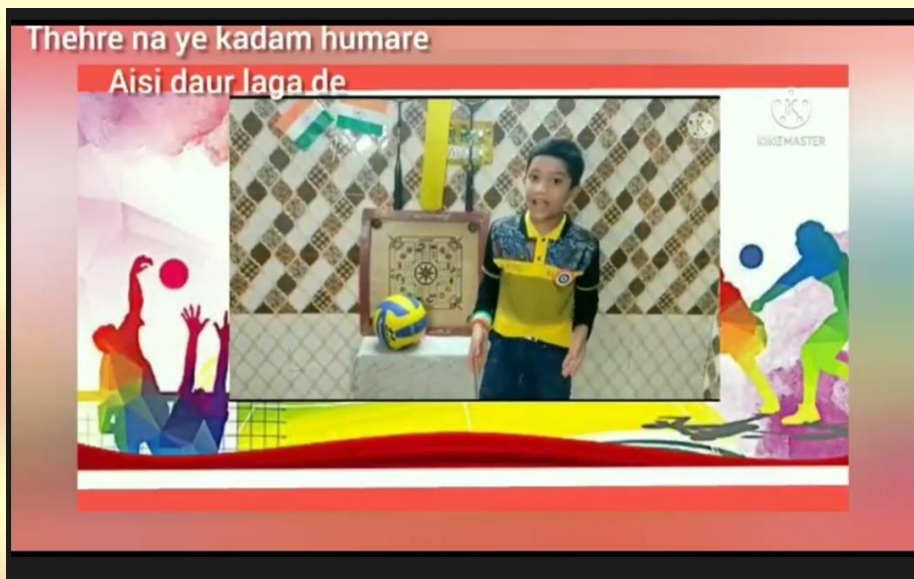

"Grandparents are a delightful blend of laughter, caring deeds, wonderful stories and love".

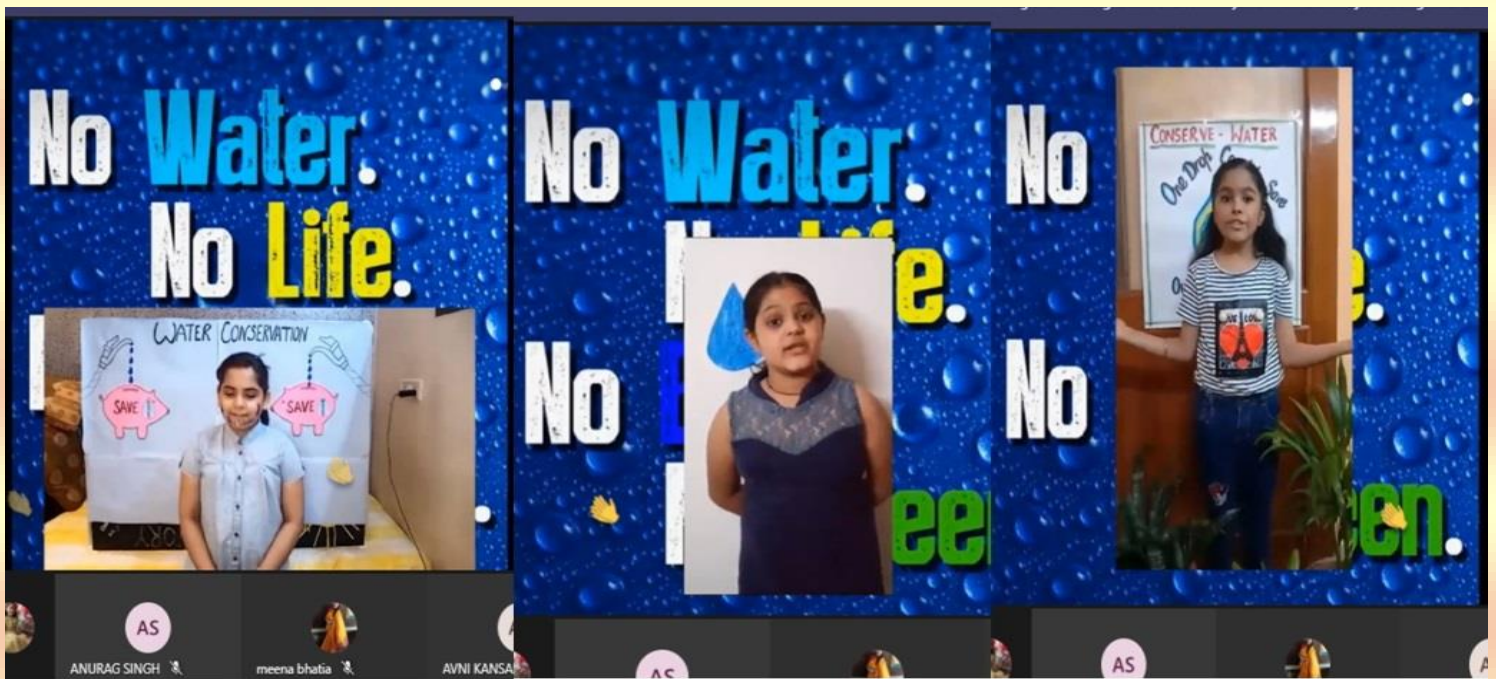

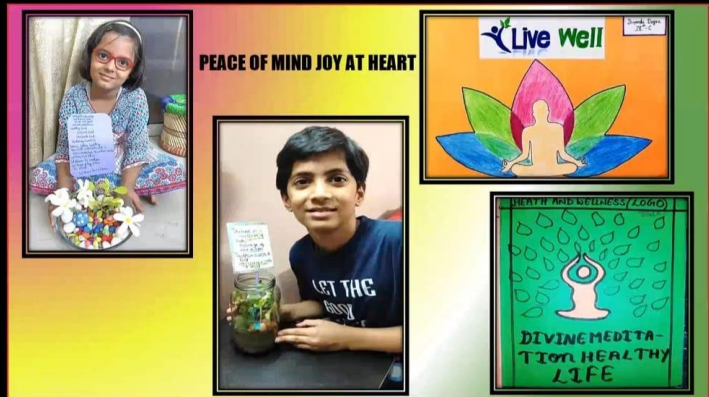
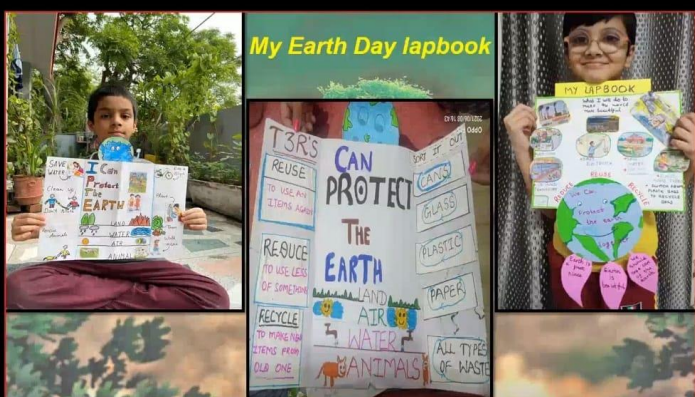


Striking Display at the Virtual Exhibition 2021

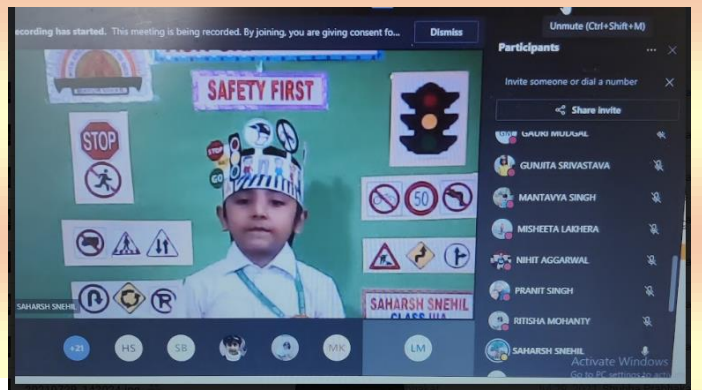
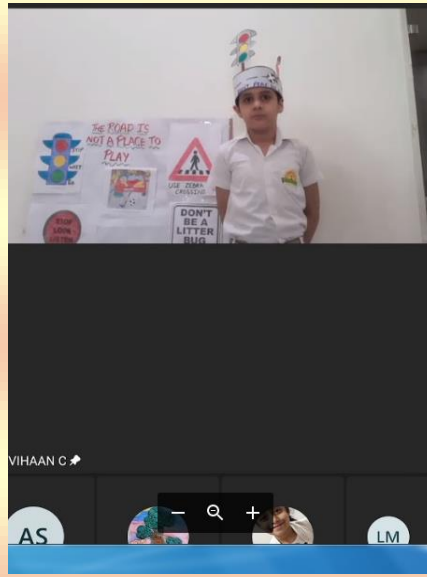
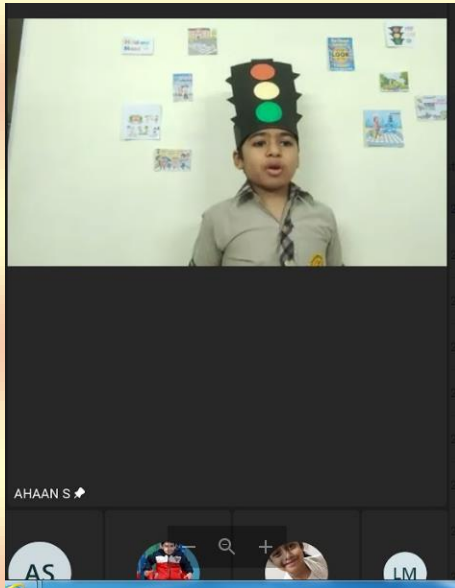
Recitation Competition

International Yoga Day

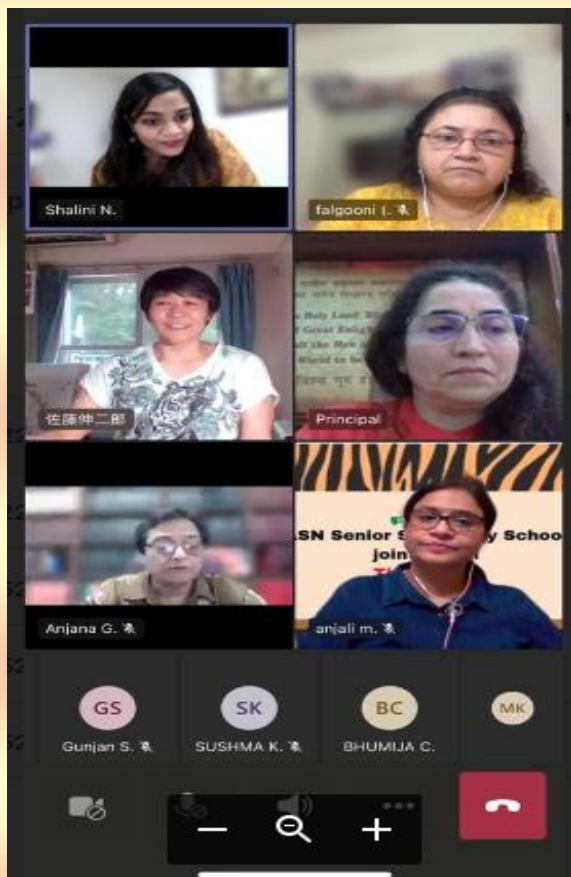
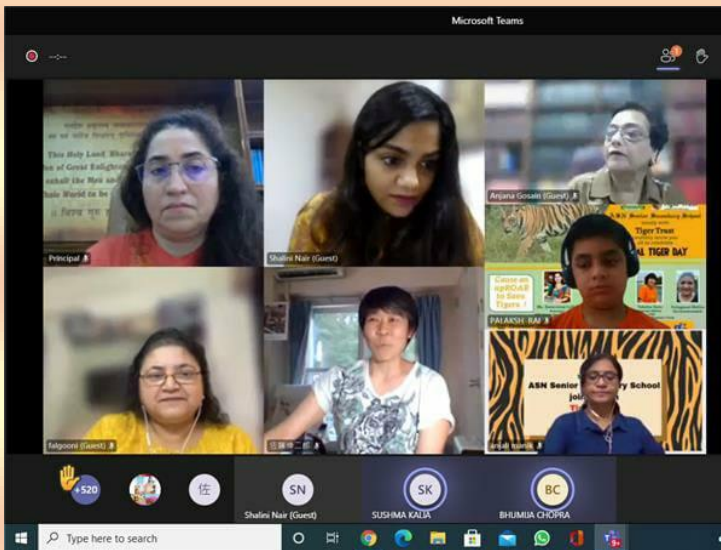

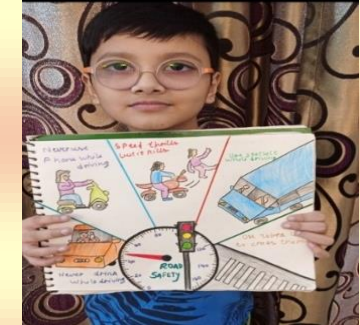
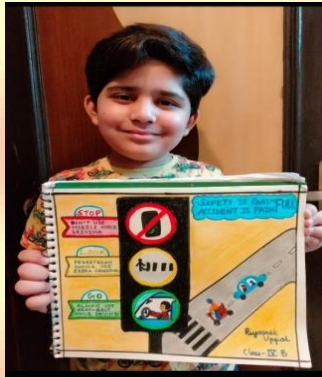
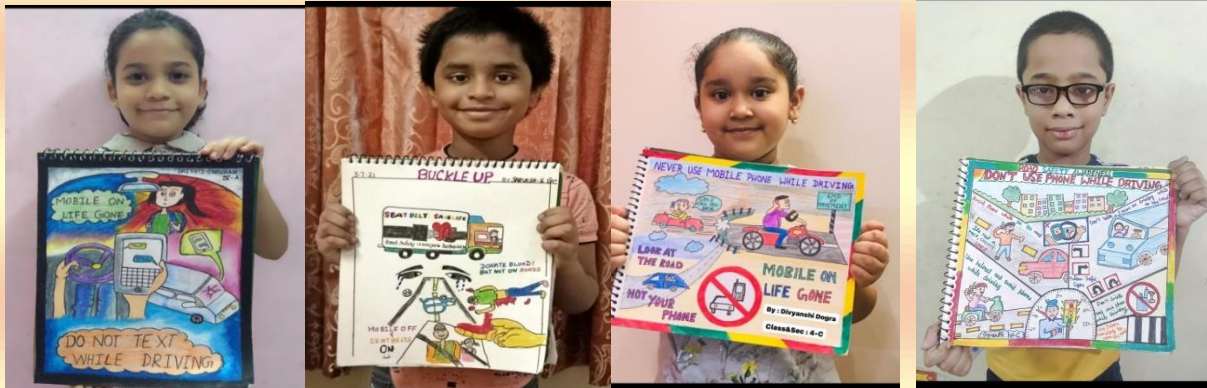
Safety Matters

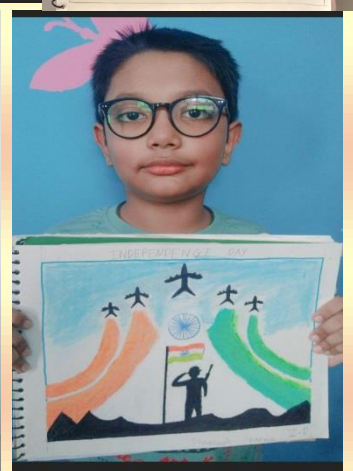

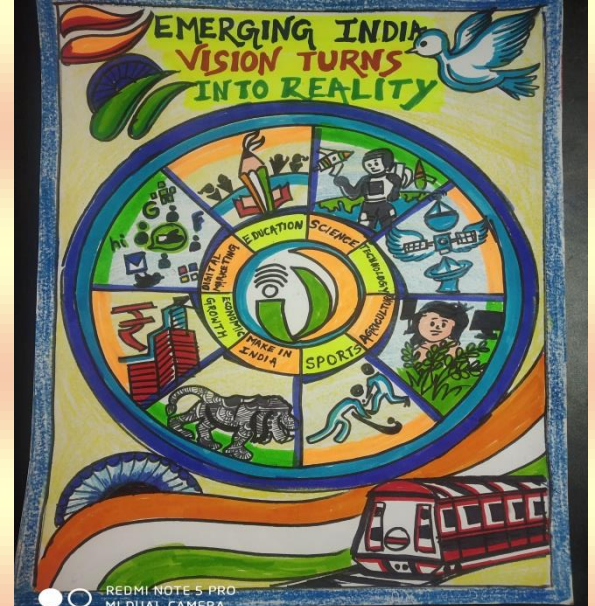

VOICE IT OUT - ENGLISH DEBATE

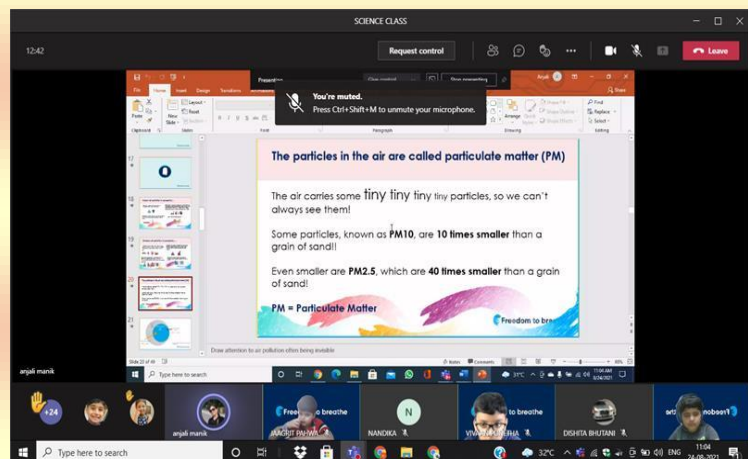
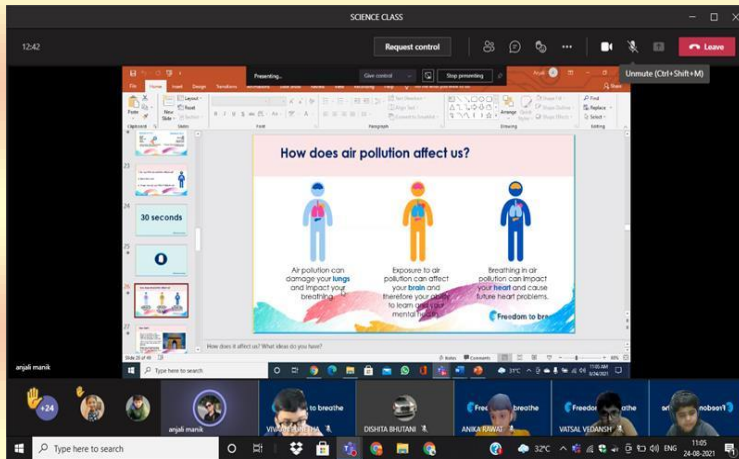

‘Be part of the Solution and not part of the pollution.’

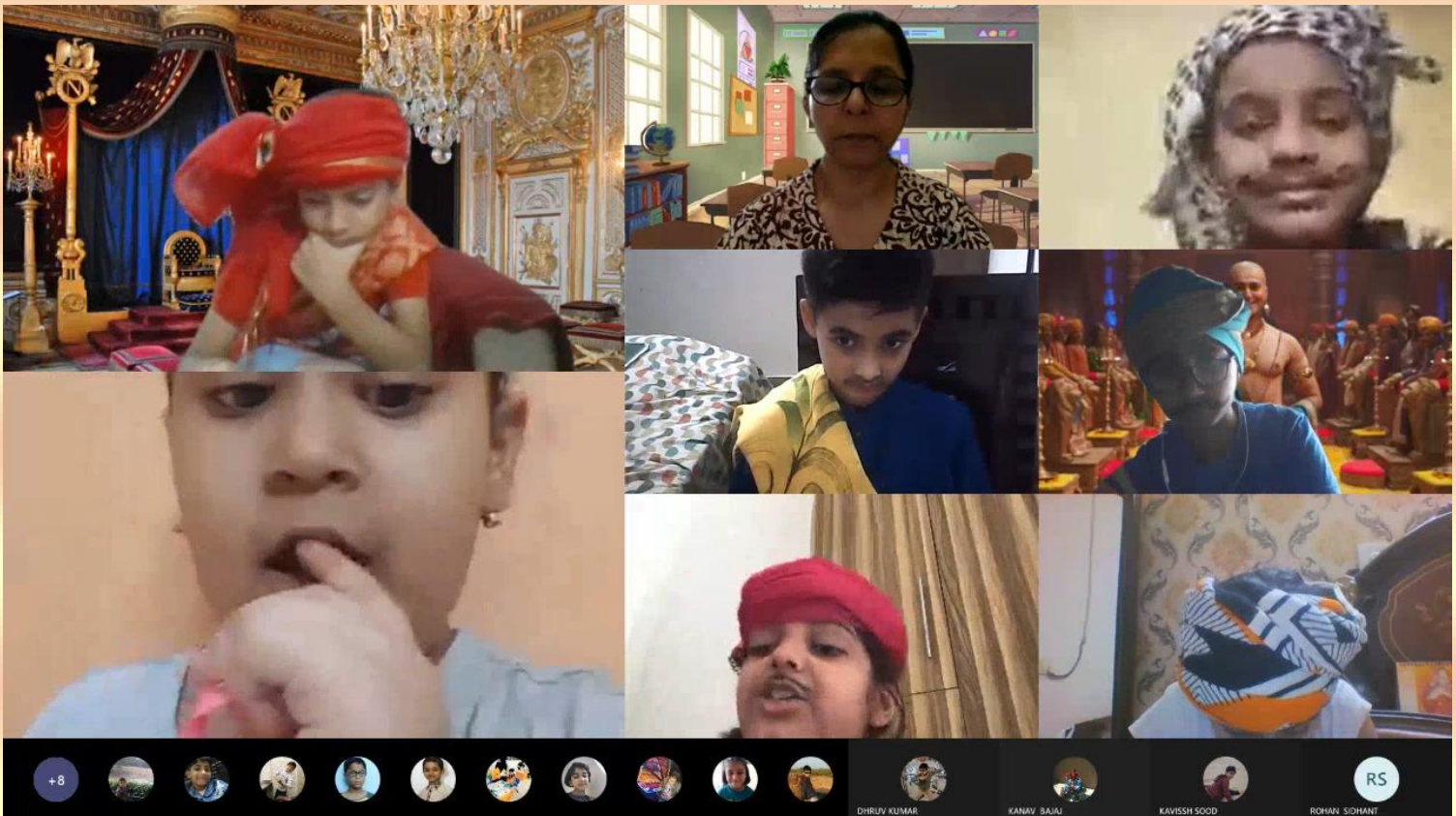
