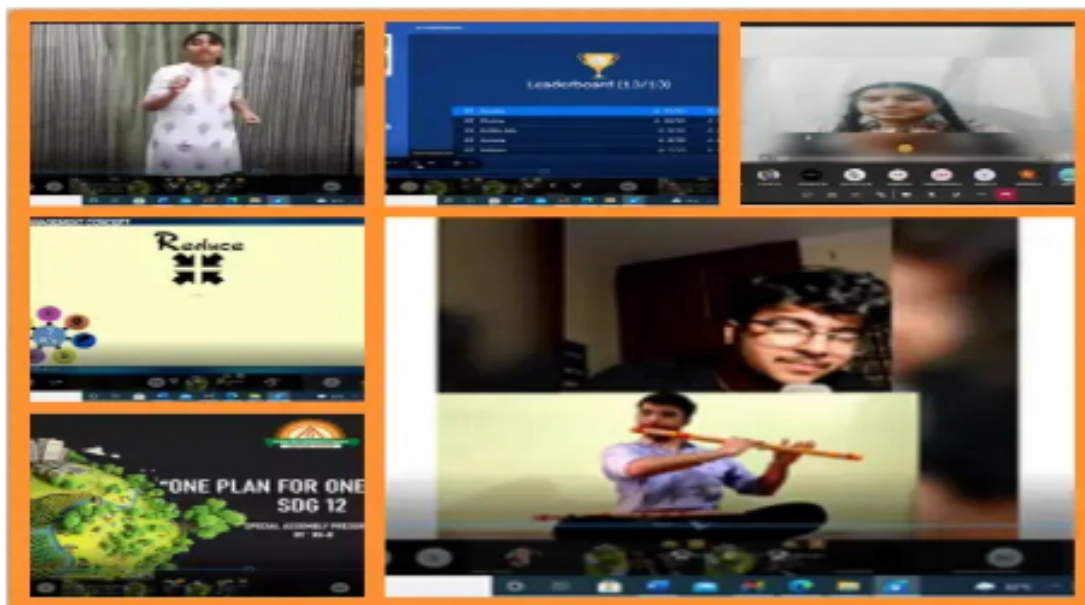

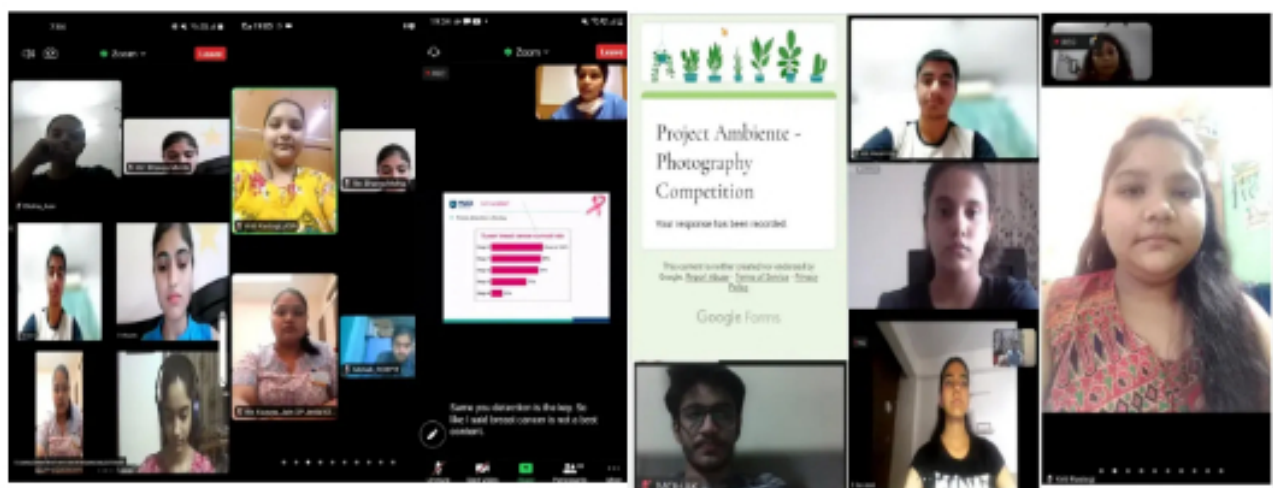


# CLASS ASSEMBLIES

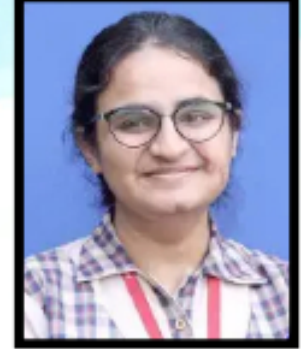

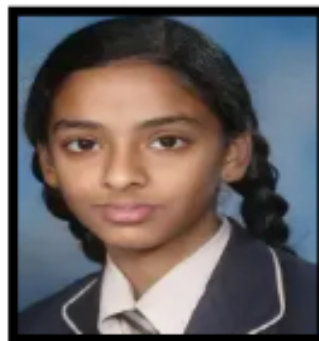

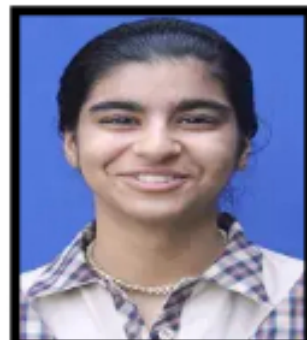

# WORKSHOP ON ROAD SAFETY

ASN SR SEC SCHOOL, MAYUR VIHAR , conducted a webinar on traffic awareness led by Head Constable Mr. Sunil Sen. In this educative webinar, Students were informed various aspects of road safety. Children were urged to follow all the road safety rules laid by the government. A PowerPoint presentation covering an array of subjects, including rising numbers of road accidents, unsafe driving, fatalities and emotional impact on kins was shown to students.

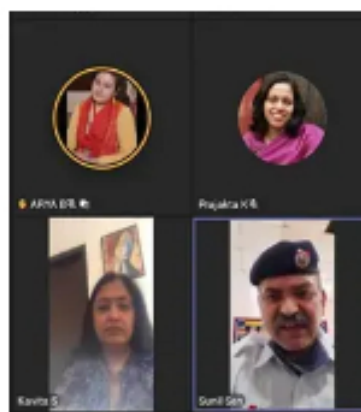
The stress was given on raising consciousness for compliance with traffic rules, cautious movement of the pedestrians on the streets and carrying the victims to the hospitals at the earliest possible time. Pictures showing breaking of rules, not following the norms were shown to gather the attention of the students.

Traffic Head Constable Mr. Sunil Sen also talked about the threats of using mobile phones while driving and walking on the road. He emphasised that school going children should only ride bicycles and no other vehicle as they are not legally permitted to obtain a Driver's Licence below the age of 18.

Infact, the children were also informed the importance of wearing helmets, while driving ,riding or sitting on two wheeler vehicles. It was told that how important it is to wear an ISI marked Helmet. The right way of wearing helmet and seat belt was also shared. Also, he touched upon the cardinal principles of travelling on the road like, looking towards both the sides before crossing the road and contacting the traffic police during any emergency etc.

At last the speaker, Mr Sunil Sen urged the students to not only follow the norms but also asked them to aware their nears and dears for the same.

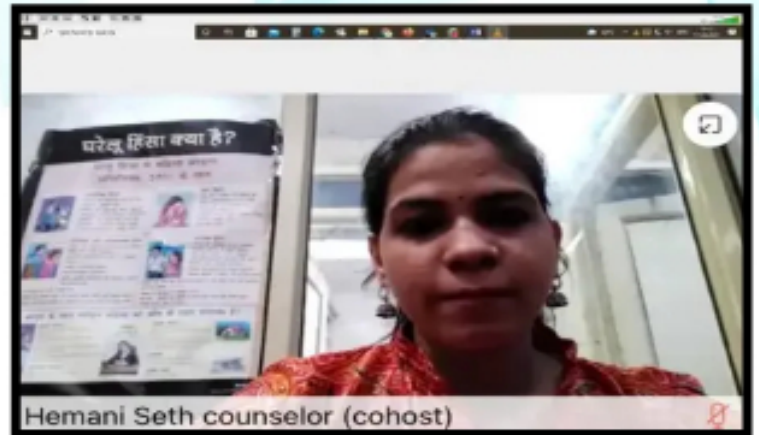

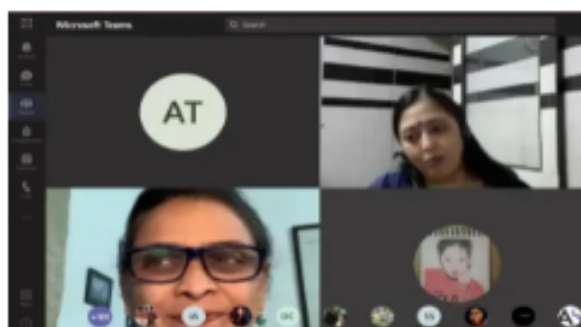
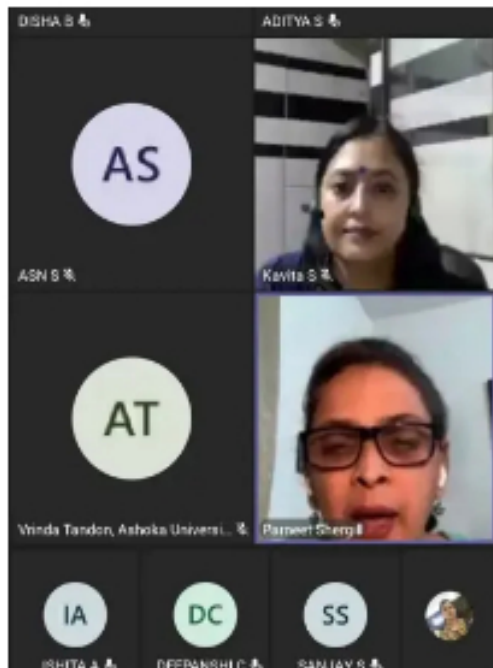

## WORKSHOP ON NO TOBACCO

The tobacco epidemic is one of the biggest public health threats and remains one of the leading preventable causes of death world-wide. Facts states that consumption of tobacco is more rampant in youth. To spread awareness against tobacco consumption and damage done by it on human body, informative webinar sessions were organized for its prevention by ASN SR SEC SCHOOL on 2nd and 9th of August. The workshop also aimed to expose devious practices and manipulations done by the tobacco and related industries who attract and ensnare young children and make them a prey. The guest speaker was Dr. Kundu, a renowned medical practitioner and Dr BS Chaman, Additional Director DHS who deliberated upon the use of tobacco and its glamourization that leads to naïve minds succumbing to it.

Expounding upon the reasons and situations the guest speaker Dr. Kundu remarked that teenage population is the most vulnerable group that can fall a prey to the consumption of different types of tobacco if they lack the awareness of industry tactics that deliberately employs to hook them through various products. Through a power point presentation Dr. Kundu shared an alarming statistics of tobacco users and various life-threatening illnesses that occur because of it. The presentation depicted how cigarette habit starts off among the youth and soon turns into a deadly fad. Most of the children try using some form of tobacco product as a result of peer pressure, getting influenced by advertising industries or simply because they are not equipped to refuse

it.

She laid stress that tobacco products in any form are injurious to health and points out that nicotine in tobacco makes the brain more susceptible to synthetic drug addiction and chewable tobacco products are more addictive than cigarettes. E-cigarettes that are touted as less harmful have concentrated doses of nicotine and slow ingestion of nicotine is more detrimental. Since smokeless tobacco products are more affordable substances, does not have visible intoxication effects and students can use it even in class or home without meeting the eye of the teacher or the parent so as beginners' children easily gets attracted to it.

Answering to the queries raised by the students on the measures taken by the government to check the menace, the panelists remarked that it cannot be completely curbed with legislative measures alone and conscious efforts by society and users are necessary to kick the butt. The workshop concluded with the students learning the lesson on when to say NO TO TOBACCO. Dr. Kavita Sharma, Director of Academics, extended the vote of thanks to esteemed guests for effective and informative counselling sessions.
